## **Notice to All Tenants**

It has come to my attention that several individuals at this tenancy are apparently unaware of how to clean up after themselves following a successful hunt.

First of all, skulls and other undigested bones should be rinsed, then placed in the (GRAY) organic remains trash receptacle (which is collected on alternate Tuesdays). This is the third warning to be delivered this semester and, if our cleaning crew find these lying on the kitchen sides again, they will be refusing service to this building. It is not their job to dispose of your partially digested meals.

On that note, any articles of clothing or other items belonging to your prey need to be disposed of in the appropriate manner. Clothes, cell phones, and jewelery can be donated to the local charity shops or recycled. Please do not leave these items in the main lobby or hallway as doing so could constitute a fire hazard. Student Id cards, however, should be handed in to the front desk as soon as possible so that the devoured student can be removed from our records. As a reminder, these cards are university property and keeping them as souvenirs or competing to see who can collect the most is strongly discouraged.

Likewise, please do not attempt to dispose of regurgitated fur or hairballs in the kitchen sink. Either flush the resulting mass down the toilet or place it in a sealed container and dispose of it in the (BLACK) general waste trash receptacle (Collected on alternate Thursdays). Once again, your prey's fur is not considered organic waste and should NOT be placed in the same trash receptacle as their bones. Similarly, please do NOT attempt to flush leftover bones, even small ones, down the toilet.

Finally, there have also been a series of noise complaints, particularly regarding the students on the ground floor. While it is currently permitted for students to bring live prey to their rooms, you are asked to bear in mind that other students may have early morning lectures or exams. If bringing prey indoors between the hours of 12:00 AM and 7:00 AM then you are responsible for keeping them quiet. As a reminder, the front desk has a collection of easy-to-digest prey restraints, including gags, that can be purchased if required.
