
# From the Quarter Box An Examination of Titles Forgotten By Matthew L. High

Many independent comics blossomed then just as quickly disappeared in the mid 1980's. For a brief period, small independents of all kinds were openly welcomed by comics stores, and anyone who could put pen to paper had his or her own stories on the shelves. Some were good, but many others were quite awful, and hype and speculation quickly turned the boom to bust. Just as quickly as small companies and titles appeared, they quickly vanished, never to resurface. Two such titles were Morphs and Menagerie.


Morphs was first published in April 1987 by GraphXPress, and lasted for four issues, ending September 1988. Morphs was an anthropomorphic anthology title (just like Wild Life!), and featured several talented artists.

Like any anthology, some contributors showed great promise, while others received "mixed reviews". Phil Morrissey (who drew the cover to Furrlough #5), ran the first three parts of an unfinished story called Punk Mutants on Controlled Substances vs. Dalmation Alley, and yes, the story is just as wacky as the title indicates. Kitty Malone, the creation of John Speidel, makes an appearance in three issues as well. Speidel's artwork, while good, is also "cramped"; and the story slapstick and disjointed. Star Lizard, by the (then) young Tom Owens, appeared in all four issues.

A couple of non-humorous stories were written and drawn by Tom Linehan, chronicling some of the less-than-inspiring moments in the life of J.L. Coon. Bosom Enemies, by the experienced Donna Barr, started in the pages of Morphs, but never finished (Barr is better known for her continuing series, Desert Peach). Botswana Bison, by newcomer Darin Davis, showed quite a bit of promise (especially solid artwork), but Morphs ended before the story did.

The Cover of Morphs #1, by Phil Morrissey


One-shots appeared by Jerry Collins and Ken and Beth Mitchroney. Collins presents a sketchy but unique look at "your average convention". The Mitchroneys (also known for Space Ark and Myth Adventures), present Blackmare the Pirate. Mel. White (better known for Duncan and Mallory), started Shakedown Cruise, about a human stationed aboard a dragon-led spaceship, in the last issue.

Alas, by late 1988, the comic market was turning openly hostile towards independent comics, and Morphs quietly passed away, leaving several stories unfinished. GraphXPress still survives, infrequently publishing Red Shetland.

Menagerie is another anthology title that started in 1987 and ended the following year. However, the publisher, Chrome Tiger Press, only managed to eke out two issues. Scarycat and Mousekanaut appeared in both issues (with a cliffhanger in the second). The two characters, both futuristic mercenaries, were the creation of Paula Shoudy and Mike Raabe (now working on the irregularly-published Balance of Power). Tails of the Red Legion, by Clifton Jackson and Cindy Murata, appeared in one issue, as well as the beginning of Hader and the Colonel, by the inestimable Donna Barr. (Unfortunately, neither of Barr's contributions to Morphs or Menagerie are her strongest efforts, plot-wise. Fans should check out Stinz, first in the pages of The Dreamery, then as its own title.)

Menagerie was not all-anthropomorphic, as Morphs was. Two non-anthropomorphic stories appearing in the pages of the comic were *Iron Crosses* by Clifton Jackson, Chris Johnson, and Mike Raabe, as well as *Reflections* by Lana Aprill and Christopher Rush.

## **Submission Guidelines**

### Submission Guidelines

- 1. We are now accepting submissions for three anthologies.
- · Furrlough bimonthly action-adventure anthology (not limited to military). Rating is G to PG-13.
- · Wild Life quarterly general-theme anthology, geared towards humor and slice-of-life stories. Rating is G to soft R.
- · Genus quarterly anthology of material of a more mature nature (sort of a turbo-charged Wild Life). Rating is PG-13 to hard R. Not necessarily an adult
- 2. Minimum length of submissions is one page, maximum is twelve pages. For serialized stories, we prefer chapters to be six to eight pages in length.
- When presenting all story ideas, please submit pencilled samples, story guidelines and/or scripts for editorial comment. We may need to request revisions or changes and this will make both our jobs easier.
- 4. Single page illustrations and cover illustrations are invited. For covers, please submit a concept sketch or xerox of pencils for editorial comment. We can handle color work if you do not wish to.
- No stories containing ring-tailed lemurs will be accepted for Furrlough - no exceptions (Even scantily-clad ones)!

- 6. Copyrights of characters and stories will be held by their rightful creators. All artwork will be returned after publication. We are not responsible for any material lost or damaged by the U.S. Post Office.
- 7. Original art (or stats) should be in by the deadline date. This is not a set rule, but it makes our job easier.
- Payment will be made in accordance with the production/payment schedule. Payment will be sent out about 30 days after publication.
- We have the right to make editorial revisions to submitted stories.
- For series, extra pages of character profiles, situations or historical data, and technical data are encouraged.
- 11. We will not censor work, but we will not accept blatant pornography. There are no exceptions to this (Some sex and/or nudity violence will be acceptable if we feel it advances the story.)
- 12. Name and address must be included on the back of each page.
